

Welcome to Troop 4173

Troop 4173 is chartered by "Big Deuce" Chapter of the FA Association and is in the Black Beaver District of the Last Frontier Council. We encourage visitors to come to one of our meetings and see us in action.

Some Basic Information

Troop 4173 is a "youth-led" troop that develops young men into accountable leaders by stressing character development, citizenship training and personal fitness while having lots of fun.

Who we are

Troop 4173 has been in existence for sixty-five years and currently has membership of 34 scouts and 25 registered adults, 13 are registered Scoutmasters (SM/ASM). All Scoutmasters are BSA trained and collectively have decades of Scout Leader experience.

When we meet

Troop 4173 meets every Tuesday evening at 6:30 PM. Parent/Committee Meetings, to which all



parents are invited, are held on the third Tuesday of each month. Campouts are typically the third weekend of each month.

Where we meet

Troop 4173 meets at the Scout Hut Building 1450 Punch Bowl Road, Fort Sill, OK.

What we do

Our activities are based on the Scouts' plans with adult leader guidance. Once a year a planning session is held at which monthly themes for the upcoming year are decided, camping locations selected, service opportunities and other activities are identified.







Camping is a key component in the scouting program. Last year we attended summer camp at Sid Richardson Scout Ranch and a high adventure camp at the Chisholm Trail Adventure.

Monthly campouts were at Camp George Thomas, Camp Eagle at Fort Sill, LETRA, and the National Scouting Museum in Irving, Texas. Scouting is designed to take place outdoors. It is in the outdoor setting that Scouts share responsibilities and learn to live with one another. It is here that the skills and activities practiced at troop meetings come alive with purpose.

Service to others

We strongly encourage service, as it reflects the ideals of Scouting. We support multiple Fort Sill



military balls, flag placements at the Fort Sill Post Cemetery and others. Boys grow as they participate in "Good Turns" for others. We also have a partnership with VFW Post 8580, Elgin, for flag placements on ten holidays, annually.

Our troop encourages boys to develop leadership skills. Every Scout has the opportunity to participate in both shared and total leadership situations. Understanding leadership concepts helps a Scout accept the leadership role and guides him toward the citizenship aim of Scouting. In 2016, we assisted in sending one Scout to NYLT and three scouts to NAYLE, Philmont SR.

The uniform makes the Boy Scout troop visible as a force for good and creates a positive image in
